Thursday, May 2, 5:30 - 8 p.m.

### **"Our Roots Run Deep" Heritage Celebration**

### **University District Architecture Tour**

Jim McDonald, preservation architect, will lead a walking tour of the Historic University Neighborhood discussing the history, styles of architecture, the architects and builders of this National Register Historic District. Meet at the University grizzly bear statue, located at the west end of the Oval between the Lomasson Center and Knowles Hall, at 1 p.m.

### **Historic Masonry Tour**

Jim Sears, UM Professor of Geosciences; Jim McDonald, preservation architect; and Solomon Martin, historical stone mason, will lead a walking tour discussing building stone in downtown Missoula's historic buildings. The tour will feature the use of stone for structure, decorative element, and in some cases show how it is used as finishes on the

interiors. The tour will include where many of the stones were quarried and how they were used in the different styles of the buildings. Meet at the fish sculptures on the east side of the Higgins Avenue bridge adjacent to Caras Park at 1 p.m.
