Home Fire Safety Inspection

HEATING HAZARDS:

1. Combustibles like clothes, curtains and furniture are away from stoves and heaters
2. Heating appliances are tested every year
3. There is a screen in front of the fireplace
4. Ashes are emptied into covered metal containers
5. All alternative heating devices used are UL listed

ELECTRICAL HAZARDS:

1. Electric cords are checked to be sure they are not worn, frayed or damaged
2. Extension cords are not run under rugs or across passageways
3. Proper size fuses are used in all sockets
4. Each circuit is properly marked
5. Electrical outlets are not over-loaded by multiple plug devise
6. Electrical appliances are not used near water

GENERAL HOUSEKEEPING HAZARDS:

1. Closets, basements, attics and garage areas are cleared of old papers, boxes, paint cans and other trash
2. Rubbish is thrown away regularly
3. Everyone in the family knows **NOT** to use a flammable liquid for cleaning (gasoline, mineral spirits, etc.)
4. Flammable liquids and oily rags are disposed of after use or stored in a tightly closed metal container
5. All combustibles are stored a safe distance away from any possible heat source (furnace, hot water heater)
6. Clean the lint tray on your clothes dryer after use and don't forget to clean the lint inside the air exhaust hose attached to the back of your dryer (every 6 months)

1. Matches and lighters are kept out of reach of children
2. Smokers use ashtrays that are large, deep and won't burn
3. **NEVER** smoke in bed

GENERAL FIRE SAFETY:

This inspection form is designed to help you check your home for fire hazards. Print it and take it along with you as you do your own inspection. All the questions are worded so “YES” means the area is safe. A “NO” answers means a fire hazard exists and needs to be corrected.

If you have any “NO” answers, sit down with your family and discuss the problems and how they can be corrected. Take this opportunity to create fire safety awareness in **ALL** family members and at the same time, make your home a safer place to live.
