— Introductions of those present.**— Correction to the Minutes made and July minutes approved.****— Public Comment**

- Diane talked about chronic barking dogs in her neighborhood 1850 S. 12th St. in alley.
- John Wolverton--Russell Reconstruction project: Need volunteers. Also, we should get agendas and announcements of next meeting by email.

— Presentation: Chief Francechina is here to listen about the at-large dogs and consider a block watch type of work to find loose dogs. Police usually involved with chronic barking, dog bikes, etc. Police come to the scene, take record, attempt to find the dog, the honor. Really likes the idea of a “block watch” for unique and/or chronic problems. Talk to neighbors and try to address the issue.

Ed, Animal Control: For chronic barking call the animal control office. We will investigate and give advice to the owner. The complainer is mailed a barking log and complainer must keep detailed log of barkers. If the dog owner says the log is inaccurate then complainer must testify in court. It helps to have 2 complainers. We understand people are reluctant to testify. It would be best if you try to work this out on a neighbor to neighbor basis.

A household is only allowed 2 dogs per residence. You can apply for a multiple dog permit approved by the animal control board.

Dogs off leash or not the same as a dog at-large (no owner). For dogs off leash try to get an address of owners.

Ordinances are on the web site. Go under Animal Control Ed brought 3 ordinances: 1) at large ordinance, cat ordinance and 3) feeding wildlife. Others can be found on web site.

RE: Dogs leaving their property without leash. They can not be aggressive off their property. If they are then call Animal Control. All bites must be reported for dogs or cats.

When you give a dog away you must call Animal Control and tell them you know longer are the owner. Otherwise you could get a ticket for the dog that is still registered to you.

Another way to address nuisance dogs is to research the owner of the rental property and see if you can have him or her bare down on the renters.

Shave a loose dog or spread green dye on them. This is a subtle way to tell the owner that his dog is off leash and bothering people.

Underutilized service is “Bite Prevention” classes.

—TIGER grant

The grant is part of the stimulus package; the Missoula MPO will organize the Active Transportation project, valued at \$50m and already on the shelf, by 08-15-09, to submit by the 09-15-09 deadline. This project builds trails and CSG; the latter will require less than \$20m of the grant request. It involves a “buy-in” of a 40/60 SID. Missoula applied for trails and sidewalks for \$19.6M.

Motion made to approve the letter of support for the Tiger Grant written by Jon Salmonson, Write an additional letter with a little more generic reference to the neighborhood.

—Community Forum Update-Bus Tour

Fall bus tour is Sept 26 and will cover our neighborhood. Theme is “Uniquely your Neighborhood” Suggestions for our uniqueness with the votes noted in parentheses are:

2. Opportunity & Diversity: to live, to work, to do business, to walk and to drive (4)

4. Pocket Park at Grant and 8th (2)

5. Mary's St. crossing (1)
6. New traffic calming around Franklin School (0)

—Update on Complete Streets

Complete Streets Resolution covers sidewalks and curbs and lighting for all. Resolution was passed by the City Council on August 24.

—CS Porter Grade Separated Crossing

Speed zone reduction is being implemented on Reserve.

Motion: We strongly support an underpass or overpass for bike and pedestrian crossing of Reserve at CS Porter Middle School and request that the highest priority of this project.

Recommend to agency officials that they make the overpass or underpass be moved into the funded category of the LRT Plan. [Tabled to the next meeting](#).
