Plans for Orange St. Interchange - (Shane Stack MDOT):

- Discussion of deficiencies at Orange street and Van Buren exits
- Deficiencies will be mitigated with roundabouts
- At Orange St - main impact on 5th and 3rd streets
- Questions related to overall benefit/safety were answered
- Shane explained that cross walks (where east bound highway traffic comes in) and sidewalks will be safer for pedestrians and cyclists
- Improvements for Orange St. exit scheduled for 2016, priority over Van Buren

- This won't happen quickly as deferred Maintenance is big issue
- Smart Schools 2020 - will involve multiple bonds. Lowell planned to get some of the biggest repairs.

Q&A with Bryan von Lossberg :

-White Pine Sash

- Recent public meeting - DEQ heard again concerns that cleanup will not be residential
- Project Manager just left and may have impact on timeline
- Decision will be end of November

NorthSide Odor Issue

- Site visit at Emerald Services
- No methane has been detected
- Encourage neighbors to call 911 when there is a natural gas smell

Municipal Ownership of Mountain Water

- Some progress but an ongoing issue
- Revisions to decision will be discussed next council meeting
- Complicated issue, committees and council will continue to educate community
- Best reasons for city ownership of water supply has to do with quality, user's control of decision-making related to infrastructure and transparency to citizens
- Missoula community deals with 40% leakages vs national approximate average of 20% leakages
- Capital going into the system will be challenging (if city-owned) but more efficient and there is

no profit goal to impact decisions

-City would inject 50% more into system and revenue bonds would be used

-Acknowledgement of risk

-Currently Missoula's water system is among the highest rates in Montana with worse repair
