Donna,

I just realized that I did not send you an estimate for lighting the Milwaukee Trail segment Garfield to Grove street.

I recently looked at this segment of trail and found that installing the lights will be somewhat complicated due to the tight easement (very little room between the edge of the trail and the easement line). Additionally, working around the irrigation culvert along Grant will be difficult. Due to the tight easement, I recommend hiring a surveyor to stake the pole locations to ensure that they are placed within the trail easement.

The first phase of the trail lighting (Orange to California) was relatively wide open and the cost per pole was \$6,400 (includes conduit, wire, etc.). The last phase (Catlin to Garfield) was \$8,800 per pole due to the narrow easement. The future segment from Garfield to Grove will be similar to the last phase due to the narrow easement. Therefore I recommend budgeting \$8,800 per pole location. I am estimating that this segment will require 52 poles (approximately 5200 ft of trail with poles spaced 100ft on center average)

Below is a recommended budget:

Milwaukee Trial Lighting - Garfield to Grove 5/31/15 Budget	
\$ 457,600	Poles, pole bases, LED fixtures, conduit, wire, electrical meter, etc (52 poles)
\$ 8,500	Surveying
\$ 14,000	Engineering services (construction plans, specs, bidding, const. admin, etc)
\$480,100	total
