### CDBG Grant Application

#### —Hydrants

- Detailed report on lacking hydrants
- 3 additional are already approved for original CIP
- Now looking at 4 additional hydrants
- In our infrastructure plan we had 9. This would give us 7
- Hydrants are ready to go (shovel ready)

#### —Another option - traffic calming for Johnson

- If in place of hydrants then we would need additional funds that don't exist

#### —So hydrants is the better fast solution

- 18 neighborhood in Community Forum
- Repeated concern: sidewalks SID, construction of streets, SID assessments, etc.
- Community Forum researched how other cities address improvements
- Survey Assessed opinions on 2 items
  1. Create Street Maintenance districts would created funds for pot holes, leaf removal, repair, etc. Minor sidewalk repair AND cover some improvements
  2. Create Park Maintenance District of the Infrastructure Survey

### Kathy Question to OBG Mike B

- Important for us to build a neighborhood plan based on projected in-fill development
- We need to preserve what open space we have and to encourage development in other areas.
- Land use and zoning changes will be difficult
- Does the city council want to do neighborhood plans
- We could do a neighborhood character overlay under the new zoning rules
- Could do a quick and dirty amendment to the X plan to prioritize open space for parks.. The neighborhood planning does not use people's energies well.
- Neighborhood plan will not help protect land for parks.
- F2F infrastructure plan does not protect land for parks.
