Announcement – Jim Hausauer explained the petition he circulated in support of prioritizing a grade-separated pedestrian crossing over Reserve at CS Porter School.

Presentation: Todd Gass of the Missoula Redevelopment Agency made a brief powerpoint presentation setting forth the URD III curb, sidewalk, and gutter (CSG) project. The mission of MRA is to reduce blight, therefore CSG falls within their purview. The job will take four years, to be implemented in four phases, each valued at about \$1m. Ellen Buchanan explained how the tax-increment financing for the CSG in the area works, obviating the need to assess the property owners, commercial or private. The project will not involve other major infrastructure, such as water and sewer mains.

Jim Hausauer suggested they prioritize CSG along Grant from 14th St to North Avenue, as being part of the Safe Routes to School path.

Parks & Trails Committee – Jon Salmonson, Jim Hausauer, Mike Greathouse

Have been researching potential parcels for creating more parks in the neighborhood. Mike Barton (Office of Planning & Grants) has agreed to join the committee to research the possibility of a like-for-like trade of USFS land for city-owned land near Fort Missoula, in the effort to acquire the USFS parcel southwest of 14th St and the tracks.

Summer Social

The Summer Social was unanimously held to be a great success, with a good turn-out and new sign-ups. Jon Salmonson was acknowledged for the wonderful job he did in managing to get the new trees planted in Franklin Park, and inspiring the City Parks and Recreation Dept. to pay more attention to the need for trees in our neighborhood.

Traffic Calming

Eric (10th St & Garfield) presented his preliminary plan for traffic calming on Garfield: bulb-outs, with a 9-ft travel lane separated from a 4-ft bike lane by a 3.5-ft pedestrian island. Also suggests rotating the orientation of the stop signs at 10th St and Garfield.

Eric will head up a committee to get this traffic calming effort going with the city; several members volunteered to assist him. He circulated a sign-up sheet for anyone interested.

New Business

- TIGER grant is part of the stimulus package; the Missoula MPO will organize the Active Transportation project, valued at \$50m and already on the shelf, by 0815-09, to submit by the 09-15-09 deadline. This project builds trails and CSG; the latter will require less than \$20m of the grant request. It involves a "buy-in" of a 40/60 SID for sidewalks. [K2]
