1. Update on Missoula Area Flooding. (<u>memo</u>)—Regular Agenda (Dave Strohmaier) (Referred to committee: 06/13/11) **REMOVE FROM AGENDA**

Todd Klietz informed the committee of the levies in the area.

Steve King stated the chart of communication that is in the power point is aimed more towards emergency situations and that his points of contact for the City are John Engen and Bruce Bender.

Ed Childers and Jon Wilkins both stated they would like the Council to included on the communication chart.
