Dave Strohmaier discussed the background of the proposed cell phone restrictions.

Adam Hertz stated that he is opposed to revisiting cell phone restrictions. He cited the difficulty of enforcement.

Caitlin Cople supports revisiting cell phone restrictions. She would like to review information from other communities in Montana that have enacted laws prohibiting the use of cell phones while driving.

Dick Haines expressed concern for the potential impact of a cell phone ban on the business community. He recognized the hazards of using a cell phone while driving. He also expressed concern about the impact on visitors to Missoula who are unaware of the law. He supports further discussion of this issue.

Mike O'Herron indicated his support for further discussion on this issue. He would like to see more data.

Jon Wilkins described some personal experiences with traffic hazards caused by drivers distracted with their cell phones. He expressed concern for the potential impact of a cell phone ban on the business community. He indicated support for a 'hands-free' option. He supports further discussion of this issue.

Dave Strohmaier would like to review data from other Montana communities that have enacted laws prohibiting the use of cell phones while driving.

John Baker articulated his opposition to enacting a law prohibiting the use of cell phones while driving. He cited public opposition to the proposal. He feels that existing laws can be used to combat distracted driving.

Ed Childers indicated his support for further discussion on this issue.

Alex Taft indicated his support for further discussion on this issue.

Jim Nugent suggested discussing the issue with the Helena Police Chief since Helena has already enacted a law prohibiting the use of cell phones while driving.
