Re: Pentachlorophenol on Greenough Bridge

Dear City of Missoula,

The Lower Rattlesnake Leadership team and the General Neighborhood Council are concerned about the use of Pentachlorophenol ('penta') on the wood bridge decking near the southern end of the Park. We are fully supportive of keeping infrastructure maintained and operational, yet we request that more natural preservatives and/or materials be used for such projects.

On May 15<sup>th</sup>, 2015, 90 countries voted to completely ban the use of Penta, due to evidence linking this chemical to cancer, as well as to deficiencies in the blood, liver, kidney and immune systems of people.

We request that the City of Missoula find a way to remove the Penta treated wood as soon as possible. Without removal, off-gassing will likely occur for years or even decades, children and others will continue to play on the bridge (sometimes with bare skin contacting the decking), and it is likely that the Penta is migrating into Rattlesnake creek, affecting the health of our community ecosystem.

If the City cannot remedy this situation, our neighborhood may be able to help find money and volunteers to make the bridge healthy for all.

Re: Roundabout design for Orange/I-90 and Van Buren/I-90

Dear City of Missoula and Montana DOT,

The Lower Rattlesnake Transportation Committee, Leadership team and the General Neighborhood Council are concerned about the design of the upcoming roundabouts to Orange/I-90 and Van Buren/I-90. While we recognize the general safety and flow benefits of modern roundabouts when compared to traffic signals, we are requesting some modifications to improve the safety for people walking and bicycling.

The 3 primary concerns with regards to the Van Buren Roundabouts are excessive motor vehicle speed, the pedestrian crossing of the 'slip lane' that goes onto I-90 and the bicycle crossing of that same slip lane. These 3 concerns are illustrated on the back of this letter, as shown by the Missoula Institute for Sustainable Transportation.

With regards to the upcoming roundabout at Orange/I-90, the primary concern is, again, the excessive speed that can be obtained by motorists coming off the Interstate. Excessive speed is a leading factor in crashes and also a leading factor in perceived safety and comfort, especially for those on foot or on bike.

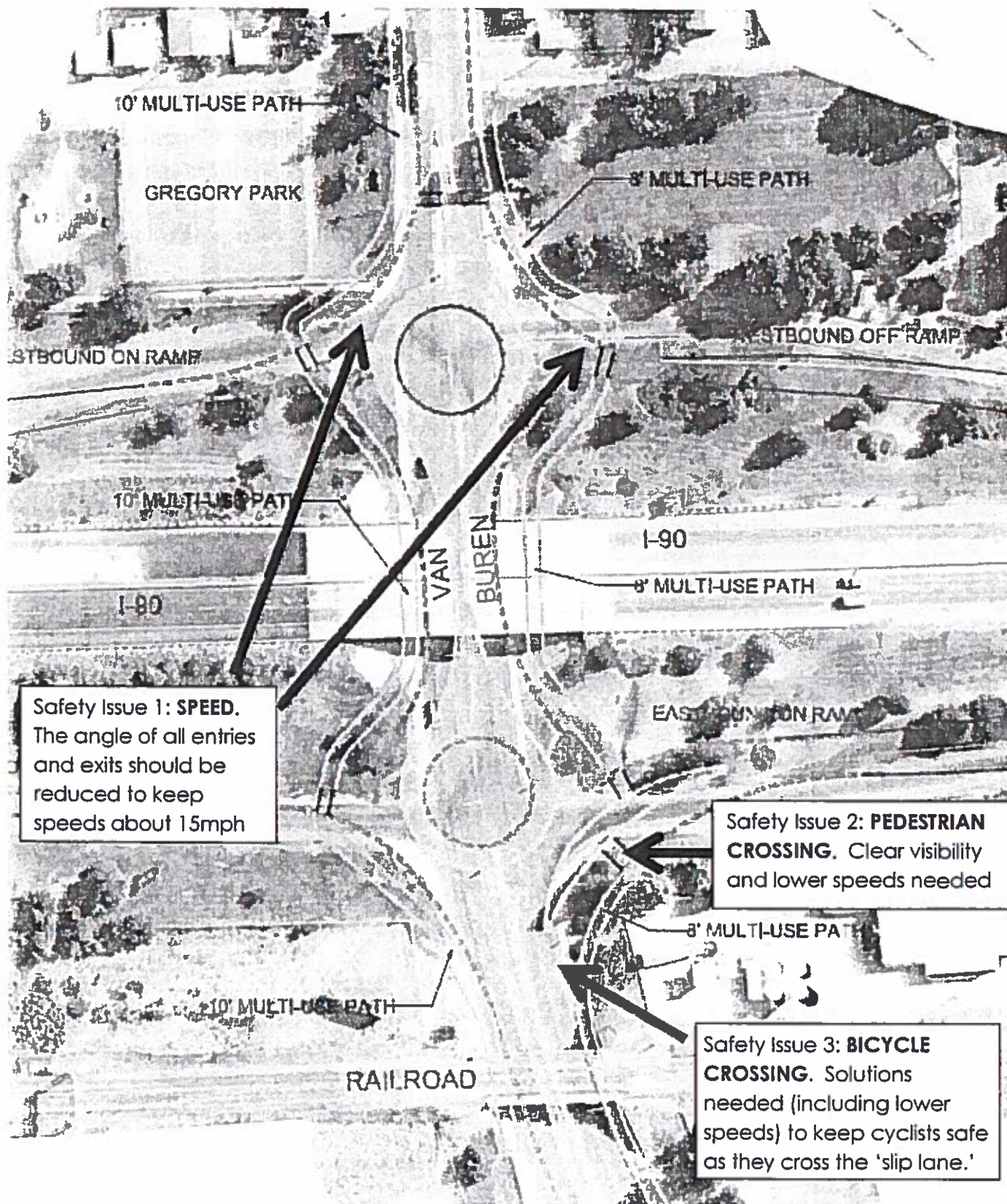
