Description and justification of project and funding sources:

Lack of curbs and sidewalks has been identified in the URD II study of blight and the URD II Plan as a condition contributing to blight in the Urban Renewal District. The MRA began a program of constructing new curbs and sidewalks in URD II in FY 10 and has completed most of the sidewalks south of the river and west of Russell Street. This project will continue until all of the missing curbs and sidewalks in URD II have been constructed. The location of the FY13 project(s) has not yet been determined; however, the amount of funding that can be dedicated to that is reflected in this document.
