	Description and justification of project and funding sources:														
	<p>Purchase and Installation of attractive fencing and gates to surround the 4 Splash Decks in the various parks. As these Splash Decks are located in open parks, stray animals are often running through them or introducing feces into the water, possibly releasing organisms that are resistant to chlorine into the water and thus increasing the risk of exposure to children who decide to drink the recreational water. Illnesses from this exposure can cause extreme discomfort or even death in at risk populations. Installation of black, wrought iron fencing will provide a pleasing aesthetic and will help keep stray animals out of the water. Montana State Department of Health is currently considering requiring fencing around all such facilities.</p> <p>Plan would fence 2 decks per year as follows: Franklin & Westside in FY13, Bonner and Marilyn in FY14.</p>
