MRA purchased the island on the north bank of the Clark Fork River just east of the California Street bridge in FY12. This project will develop the island such that it can become part of the Riverfront Trail system and provide public access to the river for swimmers, fishing and boating. The island has been a haven for transients and undesirable activities over the years. This project will clean the property up in a manner that will inhibit its use for other than recreational purposes. MRA funded the engagement of a design team in FY13 to work with the various stakeholders and regulatory agencies to design the new park and to provide funding to construct the improvements in FY14.

(0-3) 3	Implementation is past due and has only been delayed by the time required to acquire the property. The safety issues that exist on the island impact an increasing number of citizens as more residential development occurs along the riverfront. The relocation of the Poverello Center to that area increases the urgency to redevelop the property in a way that discourages improper and undesirable activities.			4	
7. Does the project conserve energy, cultural or natural resources, or reduce pollution?		(0-3) 2	Development and maintenance of the island will decrease garbage and debris from collecting and polluting the river. Proper vegetation management will help stabilize the soils and reduce the amount of silt going into the river.			3

(0-2) 2	Off-street trail connections and safe access to the river are important community assets. Both are deemed important to the community and this project provides both.			4	8
