CITY COUNCIL - MRA ELECTRONIC SECURITY SYSTEM

VANDALISM	Vandalism is a growing concern. Intoxicated folks from the bar next door frequently throw debris and garbage in the council - mra doorways. We have had several occasions where they have thrown up in the entry way to the building. If this building is left unsecure, this problem will move inside. Defacing the paintings in this building is a significant vandalism exposure.
THEFT	The council- MRA building has valuable paintings, office, and electronic equipment. Failure to secure the building will result in theft.
LIABILITY	There is some liability exposure here in the City of Missoula as required by the Montana Safety Culture Act to provide a safe place for employees to work. We also have an ethical responsibility to provide a safe place for the public to meet. After hours meetings have resulted in doors being left unsecured. This provides access for undesirable characters.
GRAFFITI	Graffiti is everywhere, however, it is a special concern next to a bar. Graffiti inside the building could be very costly.
SECURITY	Both the Police Department and myself have responded to numerous alarm calls for failure to enter security codes and or securing the doors. A security system could reduce these calls and reduce the exposure to theft, vandalism, and graffiti.
