Description and justification of project and funding sources:

The construction of the new Poverello Center created a need to reconstruct Cedar Street between Broadway and Hawthorne and replace the sidewalks and trees on the Broadway frontage. This project will turn Cedar into a "parking street" and increase available parking, meeting a serious need for the businesses and nonprofits located there. The project will include enhanced street lighting to address safety concerns and will correct drainage and ADA access issues that have long been a problem. Existing URD II Tax Increment Revenue will fund the project. Engineering will be completed in FY14 and the project will be bid for construction in FY15 after the heavy construction at the Poverello Center is completed. The goal is to have the infrastructure work completed when the Pov opens in the fall.
