Description and justification of project and funding sources:

South 3rd Street from Russell to Reserve has been publicly vetted as part of an environmental impact statement for reconstruction. Improvements on South 3rd Street from Russell to Reserve will consist of new curbs, sidewalks, drainage, pavement, and utility relocation.

This project will use transportation impact fees to pay for data collection and design engineering along with construction materials. Curbs and sidewalks will be assessed to the adjacent property owners. The sidewalk subsidy will apply to the assessments on adjacent property owners. City Street Division will supply labor and equipment for demolition and asphalt.

The construction work will be completed in three phases starting at Russell and working west to Reserve. Data collection, right-of-way identification, and surveying were completed in FY11. Preliminary engineering was completed in FY12. Final design and utility relocation are occurring in FY13, with Phases 1 and 2 construction beginning in FY15. Remaining Phase 3 will be designed and constructed in FY15/16.
