Description and justification of project and funding sources:

A successful Wayfinding system is based on a series of connected elements, delivered in a consistent manner and involves the use of sign types and sign standards to ensure consistency of signs, content and accuracy of information. The trail systems in Missoula are lacking in numbers and consistency of Wayfinding elements, particularly at strategic locations and are easily identifiable.

The Milwaukee Trail will be the first phase of a larger city-wide Wayfinding project. The project is a key step to implementing the recently developed adopted Wayfinding Plan for the Community of Missoula. The Wayfinding plan includes GPS points that work for 911 dispatch and emergency response. It will include a plan for trail users, actual trail and place routes, Rx Trail labels on one mile loop trail. The grant from Montana RWP RTP is for \$12,000 with matching amount from City's Wellness Program - \$5,000 and Missoula County Disaster Services for \$10,000 and In-Kind - \$5000 (MPR) for a total project of \$32,000.

The Department is also working to install new trail maps on Conservation lands. The primary objective for managing Missoula's 3900 acres of conservation land is to preserve and enhance native habitats while providing recreational opportunities for the community. A balance must be struck between use (recreation) and conservation (habitat). An inventory was completed in 2008 of all trails on conservation lands. This inventory showed that we are unable to adequately direct users to designated trails and as a result are failing to meet our primary objective. Roughly 18% of the trails in our system are user-created. While all new trail construction is assessed for impacts to native flora and fauna and go through the public process prior to construction most user-made trails do not consider habitat preservation or community desires. There is not current funding for this project.
