Description and justification of project and funding sources:

Parks & Recreation has been working with the neighborhood and mountain biking groups to identify and design a bike skills feature in the upper Rattlesnake Neighborhood. Syringa park has been chosen for the facility as part of a public park master planning process. The skills course will provide opportunities for young riders to develop skills, recreate and be active in an environment that is managed for safety and sustainable use of the land. The course should help reduce illegal riding within conservation lands on Mount Jumbo and adjacent to Rattlesnake creek. Illegal riding and course development that has lead to excessive erosion, non-sustainable volunteer trails and habitat destruction The proposal is supported by the Rattlesnake Neighborhood and the International Mountain Biking Association (IMBA). In 2016 the project was designed using City funds plus grants from Missoula County. (\$5K) and IMBA (\$10K). Design staff from Missoula County.
