Description and justification of project and funding sources:

The Montana Department of Transportation (MDT) is conducting intersection improvements including furnishing new pedestrian and signal poles at 8 intersections in downtown Missoula. At three of those intersections, Broadway/Higgins, Pine/Higgins, and Spruce/Higgins, MDT is giving the City the opportunity to powder coat the 4 new pedestrian and 4 new signal poles at each of these locations (total 28). The City has contemplated the upgrade to powder coating so that the new poles will look similar in color to existing poles that were installed a few years ago with the North Higgins Avenue Streetscape Project. MDT doesn't pay for upgrades with the projects they complete for municipalities within Montana so cities such as Missoula need to pay for upgrades to base MDT facilities/hardware. MDT will bid the powder coating as an alternative item with their improvements project and if Missoula has budgeted the money through this CIP, then MDT will award that portion of the work to the selected contractor.
