- a) Construction = \$1,547,251
 - i. Pole/Luminaires purchase = \$738,461
 - ii. Construction/installation = \$808,790
- b) Preliminary Engineering (at 15% of construction/installation) = \$121,319
- c) Construction Administration (at 10% of construction/installation) = \$80,879
- d) Total = \$1,749,449
- e) Indirect cost (estimated at 10.97%) = \$191,914

Project funding breakdown:

- a) Federal TA Program funds requested (including IDC rate) = \$1,491,363 (77% of total project cost)
- b) City contribution (including IDC for local match) = \$450,000 (23% of total project cost)

5. Project Eligibility

- a) **TA Eligibility Criteria under MAP21** - The City of Missoula is an eligible entity to receive TA funds under 23 USC 213(c)(4)(B) as a local government. The project is eligible for TA funding per 23 U.S.C. 213(b): This project proposes non-motorized improvements to a shared-use path, including lighting fixtures, electrical services, and other improvements as necessary, to be constructed within existing right-of-way. These infrastructure improvements will provide critical transportation system accessibility and safety for bicyclists and pedestrians.
- b) **Consistency with TranPlan21 priorities and goals** – The project supports several goals and priorities listed under TranPlan21:

Economic Development – Policy Goal C directs MDT to “support state and local economic development initiatives to maximize new economic opportunities.” This project supports economic development by providing critical safety lighting improvements along two primary commuter paths in Missoula that travel through two of Missoula’s Urban Renewal Districts in the center of Missoula. Improvements to infrastructure such as appropriate lighting along commuter paths and roadways can reduce blight, enhance the urban environment, and promote further economic development in the districts. In the past several years, hundreds of new residential units have been constructed within 0.25 miles of both the Bitterroot Trail and
