## DEMOLITION PERMIT SUPPLEMENTAL DOCUMENT: ELECTRIC AND GAS DISCONNECTS

Application Information			
<b>Applicability:</b> Required for complete structure demolition, including demo or deconstruction to foundation. Energy and natural gas providers must review and approve demo permit applications prior to permit issuance. You can submit your application to initiate city review without their signed approval, but a signed copy from the provider (Northwestern Energy or Missoula Electric Cooperative) is required before issuance.			
<b>Directions:</b> Once you have collected signatures of approval, attach this document to your permit as a Supplemental Document in the portal - <a href="https://ci.missoula.mt.us/3300/PORTAL">https://ci.missoula.mt.us/3300/PORTAL</a> - or by emailing it to <a href="mailto:coordinators@ci.missoula.mt.us">coordinators@ci.missoula.mt.us</a> . **IMPORTANT REMINDER:** YOU MAY BE REQUIRED TO APPLY FOR AN ASBESTOS PERMIT OR SUBMIT PROJECT NOTIFICATION EVEN IF THERE IS NO ASBESTOS PRESENT!



Montana's Department of Environmental Quality (DEQ) requires all buildings to be inspected for asbestos before demolition or renovation, regardless of age or size. Even if a building is new and doesn't appear to contain asbestos, it should still be inspected. Inspections can only be conducted by Montana-accredited individuals. If the facility will be demolished in part or whole, a separate notification must be submitted to the Montana DEQ, regardless of the presence or absence of asbestos. If you are not sure what type of permit or notification you need to apply for, go to notice help and read through the flow chart for assistance (flow charts include exemptions). Failure to comply with the Asbestos Control Act may result in fines/penalties up to \$80,000.
