


Neighborhood Watch: Proactive Crime Prevention

‘Neighborhood Watch’ is an organization of concerned citizens who look out for their neighborhoods and each other. Initiated in the 1960s, Neighborhood Watch is one of the oldest and most effective crime prevention concepts in the USA. Today’s Neighborhood Watch focuses on observation and reporting of suspicious activity, not engagement with suspicious individuals.

Missoula Neighborhood Watch (MNW) is a county-wide organization that consists of General Members and a Board of Directors. Membership in MNW is open to all Missoula County citizens. Missoula Office of Neighborhoods, the Police Department and the Sheriff’s Office play active roles in MNW.

Combating bike theft

- ▶ City is implementing Project 529 for bike registration
- ▶ Project 529 app allows people to register bikes themselves
- ▶ Developed by creator of Xbox after his bikes were stolen
- ▶ Can upload pics, list bike as stolen, notify others in area
- ▶ Existing registered bikes will be added to database with city information
- ▶ You can check to see if a bike is stolen before buying a used one
- ▶ Order a “shield” to attach to your bike

Making your home safer - outside the home

- ▶ Make sure shrubs are trimmed to less than 3 feet high
- ▶ Tree branches should be at least 6 feet off the ground
- ▶ Are branches blocking exterior lighting?
- ▶ Plant shrubs and bushes at base of windows that are prickly or difficult to hide in, and that don't grow very high
- ▶ A maintained residence tells thieves that someone cares about this property




Making your home safer - outside the home

- ▶ How's your exterior lighting?
- ▶ Get ride of those incandescent bulbs!
- ▶ LED lights are great - save energy, last forever
- ▶ Make sure lights are focused downward
- ▶ Use motion sensors - easy to install, save energy
- ▶ Are exterior lights out of reach?
- ▶ Is each entryway well lit?




The photos below illustrate a typical, ineffective and wasteful, security lighting installation which creates a deeper contrast of shadows in which people can hide.




Making your home safer - from the inside

- ▶ Check your door frames for cheap, thin door jambs
- ▶ Are your door hinge pins removable from the outside?
- ▶ Was your door frame secured with 3-inch screws?
- ▶ Do you have a high-security strike plate?
- ▶ Do you have a dead bolt? Does it have a 1-inch ‘throw’?



Making your home safer - from the inside

- ▶ Do you use dowel rods or broomsticks to secure sliding glass doors
- ▶ Do you have secondary locks on your ground-level windows?
- ▶ Most garage door openers can be disabled while you are gone
- ▶ Did you know you can put a lock in your garage door track?
- ▶ Do you have a door leading into your garage, or house? How strong is it? What about the lock?



Miscellaneous items...

- ▶ Are your house numbers at least 4 inches tall and reflective? Are they covered by a bush, hidden under an awning, or poorly lit?
- ▶ Do you have a peephole in your front door?
- ▶ Do you have a safe that's secured to wall or floor?
- ▶ Have you priced outdoor security cameras lately?
- ▶ When was the last time you inventoried your valuables, especially those with serial numbers (hint: use your cell phone)
